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


#### Our collection

Close to 23,000 hours collected, out of which majority are interviews conducted by Oral History Specialists and rest collected through deposits and purchases.

### Are these oral history?



- Newspaper feature story on a personality
- Celebrity/current affairs talk show
- WW2 documentary featuring testimonies of war survivors
- Academic thesis that quotes extensively from field interviews

## Key characteristics of oral history

- systematic collection of memories and knowledge about past events and periods
- -interviewees with personal experience
- interviewers are trained and well-prepared
- recorded interviews are preserved for posterity
- made available for research purposes in adherence to interview access agreement

### Why oral history?

- fills in data gap in written/textual history
- preserves the voices of people, adding a sound dimension to written records
- captures feelings and emotions missing from text records
- provides subjective first-person insights
- gives a voice to non-elites, the illiterate and other marginalised communities
- promotes inter-generational understanding and empathy
- therapeutic effects encourages reflection on the past to achieve closure
